PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

A big welcome to all parents and students to the 2016 academic year after what I hope was a restful and enjoyable holiday. I especially welcome our new parents who have children commencing at Cherrybrook for the first time this year. I sincerely hope your involvement with Cherrybrook Technology High School will be happy and beneficial.

Outstanding HSC Results

A review of the 2015 HSC revealed many, many outstanding results. Chief among the many excellent performers were the seventeen students who achieved results, which led to each of them being recognised in the All Rounders Awards. These students are: Sarah Collins, Veronica Giang, Michael Gunn, Stasia Hendrawan, Stella Hendrawan, Alyssa Hutchings, Michael Italiano, Madeleine Johnson, Tyler Le Roux, Katie Lim, Vidhi Nanda, Hassan Naveed, Matthew Philip, Merle Runde, Pragya Singhal, Stanton Tam and Vanessa Xie, who each scored a Band Six (or the highest band available) in each of their courses of study.

We also had three students who achieved a top ten place in six separate courses of study. These were: Katie Lim, Merle Runde and Lakni Weerasinghe.

Finally students, whose works have been included in major exhibitions by the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards, include Minuri Jayasinghe in *Textstyle*, and Patrick Skeen and Michael Rawlin, whose work will be exhibited in *InTech* at the Powerhouse Museum.

An analysis of students' ATARs, which the school has been able to gather, revealed at least eleven students scored ATARs greater than 99 and 105 students scored ATARs greater than 90. In total 146 students from The Class of 2015 were recognised on the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards' Honour Roll for a total of 346 credits.

Each of these students, and their parents, will attend a special Awards Assembly at the school on Tuesday February 9 to celebrate their success.

Pleasingly, beyond these students, we also had the vast majority of Year 12 students achieve their personal goals and gain entry into the course of their choosing or commence work in their field of interest.

School Uniform

It was really pleasing to sit in the MPC at our recent assemblies and see our students return for the beginning of the academic year so well attired.

Students looked marvellous in crisp new uniforms and appropriate black leather shoes. It is now most important that this wonderful standard be maintained throughout the year. Parental support of our School Uniform Policy is vital to this.

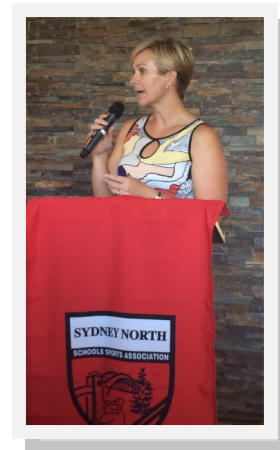

Payments can be made via cash, credit card or EFTPOS. Once payment has been received, the report will be released.

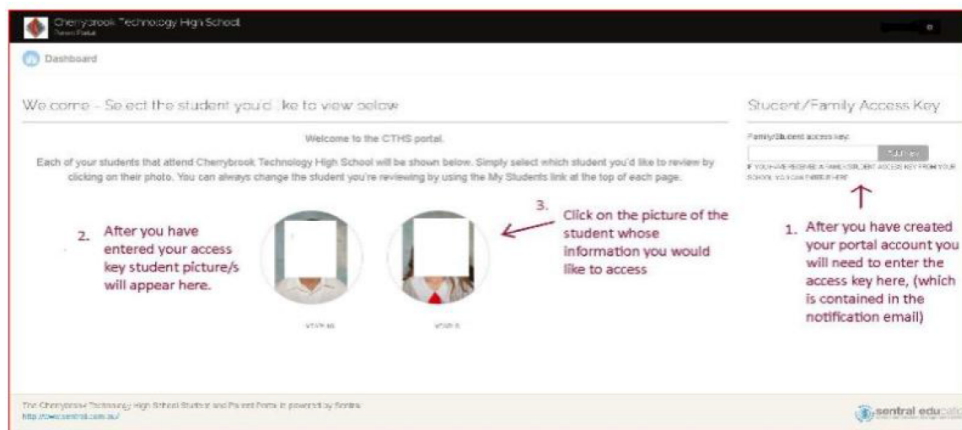

Northern Sydney Public Health Unit Year 7 Adolescent School Vaccination Program 2016

Dear Parents/Guardians

Please find following a schedule for the 2016 Vaccination Program. Year 7 Students have been given a vaccination information pack. If you wish your child to take part in the immunisation program please ensure the consent forms are returned to the student window by Monday 8 February 2016.

Please return the forms even if you elect not to have your child vaccinated.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the School Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic. Parents/guardians should ensure this record is kept for future reference and should not assume their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.

On the day of the vaccinations, students are advised:

- To ensure they have breakfast on the day
- If they are nervous, to talk to their teacher (this could also include their Year Advisor, Stage HT, a chosen classroom teacher or Mrs Navarro)
- They will be given a record of vaccination by the nurse, which is to be taken home to parents (it may be required at a later date, eg when starting work/work experience or travel)
- To bring a book or ipod with them as a distraction
- After their vaccination, they will be asked to sit quietly for fifteen minutes for observation before returning to class.

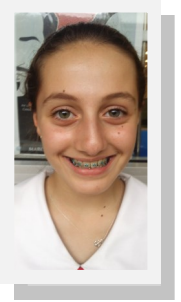


The Countdown Begins for *Grease* Opening Night

Interview with Sarah Collins 2015 HSC Food Technology Student

Examination result = 95
ATAR = 98.10

Why did you choose Food Technology?

Cooking has always been a passion of mine and I was interested in learning about nutrition and other elements related to food production such as marketing and the process of created products.

Did you discuss this decision with your parents?

Yes. They wanted me to choose subjects I was interested in and had a passion for as this would make me more engaged in the subject thus more driven to study.

Did you and your parents investigate the scaling of the ATAR for this subject?

No, neither of us did.

Did this subject help you with other courses you studied for your HSC? If yes, which ones and how?

Yes. Some of the topics doubled up with Personal Development Health and Physical Education which helped me gain a better understanding regarding this area in both subjects.

If you were to choose your subjects again would you still pick Food Technology? Why?

Yes. It was a course I thoroughly enjoyed and feel I gained a lot of knowledge that I will be able to use in everyday life.

How do you think the course could be improved?

As I am very interested in why food behaves the way it does, having more focus on the structure of food and why it changes in certain conditions, as was covered in the preliminary section, would have improved the HSC course in my eyes.

Did this course help you develop your life skills in relation to making sound food choices? How?

Yes. It has made me more aware of what to look for when buying processed food as well as marketing tactics used to promote the purchasing of unhealthy foods. Additionally, I have learnt a lot about both the importance of having a balanced diet and how to achieve this.

Will these skills assist you in the future? How?

Yes. They will help me ensure I continue making good food choices even when I'm busy at University. Furthermore, when I eventually move out of home I will have the knowledge of how to prepare my own meals and make sure I am living a healthy lifestyle.

As for other ideas I think if you really focus on the idea that you can still do really well with food tech being used and that the scaling doesn't count all that much if you are achieving the high marks.

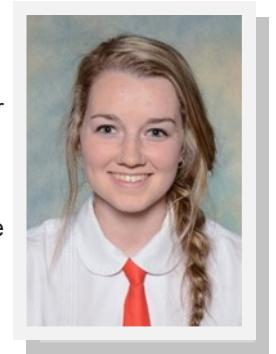
New Year, New Library
