

## DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



### AP4 Exams

Monday was the start of our trial HSC exams. As expected students were nervous, but pleasingly, also well prepared for these tests.

As always the students have conducted themselves exceptionally well during the first trying week of exams and despite the obvious pressure, remain steadfastly polite and cooperative. During the course of these exams, and indeed during the lead up to and through the HSC period, it is most important students continue to prepare well with a carefully constructed study timetable, which also includes time for physical activity and leisure pursuits. Balance at this critical time is most important.

### Students from our Japanese Sister School visit CTHS

On Thursday and Friday of last week we welcomed two students from our sister school, Nagoya Commercial High School, to our school as part of their week-long visit to Australia. We would like to thank the Hwang and Thevaseelan families for hosting these students for the two days they were at CTHS and the day of entertainment they provided their guests on the Saturday. The students mingled well with our students as they went from class to class, experiencing education Australian style. Our students are looking forward to the reciprocal visit to Nagoya in April 2019 when twenty of our students will experience education Japanese style and the delights of Japanese society and lifestyle.

### Rite of Passage Trek

On Monday and Tuesday this week, our Right of Passage Boys' group went on an overnight hike in the Blue Mountains. They walked from Blackheath Station to Perry's Lookdown Campsite. From here they descended the very steep Perry's Lookdown track down into the Blue Gum Forest before making camp at Acacia Flat. On Tuesday they made their way up the Govett's Leap track out of the valley, with backpacks heavy with camping gear, to Govett's Leap Lookout before walking back to Blackheath Station. Having done both of these tracks recently in preparation for our Kokoda Trek in July, I know how seriously steep both these tracks are! They are not for the faint hearted! They had to contend with a very chilly night camping on Monday night and an icy wind, with rain and sleet on Tuesday walking out of the valley. ### HSC Exams

Last week many very nervous Year 12 students were in a flurry of activity, busily putting the final touches to major works in English; Design and Technology; Multi-Media; Industrial Technology; Visual Arts; Society and Culture and Textiles and Design. Students will also begin practical examinations in Dance and LOTE, with the first of these being the Chinese Continuers oral exam on Saturday and Dance practicals next Tuesday. We wish our Year 12 students well during this busy and demanding time.

### Mathematics Competition

On Thursday we had 364 students sitting the annual Australian Mathematics Competition exam. This involved 195 students from Stage 4, 144 from Stage 5 and 25 from Stage 6. We look forward to hearing of their results and thank Mrs Bartlett and Miss Luu for their work in administering the test.

### CTHS Alumni Involvement in the Leaders' Induction Ceremony

We were so pleased to welcome back four of our Alumni members to the 2018/19 Leaders' Induction Ceremony last week. One of the real positives to come from engaging with our Alumni has been the opportunity for our current students to listen, talk and learn from the experiences of our ex-students and Leaders.

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### Aurecon Bridge Building Competition

Yeelin Hua, Emily Seow and Aashna Mitra Win at the State Final! Every year during Science Week, CTHS runs a Year 8 Bridge Building Competition and Year 9 Tower Building Competition. The winners of the Year 8 Competition become the CTHS representatives for the following year's Aurecon Bridge Building Competition. The Aurecon Competition is open to a team of three Year 9 students from state or private schools across Australia, with a final being held in each capital city. This year over 70 schools attended the final at the Art Gallery of NSW on Tuesday 7 August, 2018.

This year, Aurecon provided students with the opportunity to design their bridge digitally, as well as making the model to be tested. With only eight balsa wood sticks (6.5mm x 6.5mm x 580mm), eight balsa wood sticks (6.5mm x 6.5mm x 330mm), one cardboard tube (60mm diameter x 660mm), five metres of string and 125ml of PVA glue supplied, the girls had to build a bridge 700mm long which was able to hold a road deck 80mm wide. Their design was a simple truss bridge utilising the balsa wood and string, but thinking outside the square, the girls ironed the cardboard tube flat and used it to gusset the sides of the truss frames.

By late morning at the Art Gallery, only two bridges had held over 30 kg (one 33.2 and the other 41.4kg). Then our girls took the stage and the judges interviewed them for over five minutes before the bridge was put up for testing. I think the girls held their breath as the load went up until their bridge had held the greatest load for the day so far, 44.7kg! The challenge then was to hope each new bridge tested would not hold a greater load. When the final bridge was tested, at about 2.30pm, the girls knew they had won the bragging rights for strongest bridge of the day!

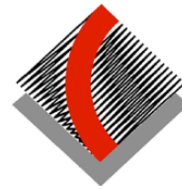

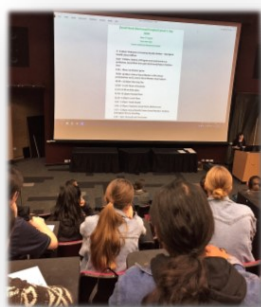

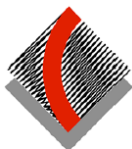
On Thursdays (sport days) all students in Years 9-11 must have their early leave notes signed by a member of the PE staff before presenting to the office.
