Year 8 and 11 Parent/Teacher Interviews

UNESCO Associated Schools in Brazil Visit

On Thursday we hosted a visit by 54 Principals and School owners to CTHS. The group are part of a UNESCO Associated Schools in Brazil group who were undertaking a pedagogical mission tour to learn from schools in New Zealand and Australia. Much of their time away was spent in New Zealand where they focussed on strategies to engage with indigenous students, families and their communities more effectively within their school setting. The one school stop in Australia was to CTHS to learn from a school with a recognised quality which could influence future directions of education in Brazil.

After a short presentation on the school by Mr Johnson our Year 12 Student Leaders led small groups on a tour before we finished with a light lunch and refreshments. Our visitors were mightily impressed with our Student Executive of whom they asked lots of questions. They gleaned a great deal from observations of classes in action as they walked around the school. They were very impressed with what they saw on their visit and some took the opportunity to exchange contact details in the hope of establishing links into the future.

Their mission for Brazilian education moving forward is to build a fairer, egalitarian, high quality, innovative education which is up to the challenges of the 21st Century. It's our belief they came to a great school, Cherrybrook Technology High School, to seek advice!

Yesterday afternoon 65 CTHS students and four teachers opted to participate in our inaugural 6K Walk for Water for World Vision. Students walked, jogged, danced, three legged-raced and hula hooped their way around Greenway oval for six kilometres, representing the fact that on average, people in developing countries walk this far to access water each day. We may take clean drinking water for granted but for 844 million people around the world it is sadly out of reach.

This was an incredibly positive and enjoyable afternoon and the CTHS community should feel exceptionally proud of its efforts. As a school we have thus far raised \$5,006, a phenomenal effort which has seen Cherrybrook Technology High School placed as the fourth most successful fundraising event in all of Australia! Huge congratulations are also to go to Eknoor Singh in Year 8 who has raised a whopping \$1,164 making her World Vision's eighth highest individual fundraiser and Dwara Ratnasiva in Year 11 who raised an equally incredible \$1,023 making her World Vision's twelfth highest individual fundraiser!

The Social Justice Committee would like to extend our heartfelt appreciation to everyone who was part of this event, showing their compassion for others and their desire to make the world a better place.

PROCEDURE FOR EARLY LEAVERS

If a student needs to leave school early, they **must** provide a note from their parent/guardian giving reasons for their partial absence. **The student must hand the note in at the student window before 8.30am** where they will be issued with a leave pass. They can then present this pass to their teacher and leave school at the appropriate time.

On Thursdays (sport days) all students in Years 9-11 **MUST** have their early leave notes signed by a member of the PE staff before presenting to the office.

PROCEDURE FOR LATE ARRIVALS

All students arriving to school after 8.40am **must** sign in at the student window where they will be issued with a late note. All late arrivals are required to have a note from their parent/guardian giving reasons for being late. No note results in a detention.

FUN FIRST AID TIPS

Chapped Lips - the Do's and Don'ts:

DO

- Moisturise your lips - lips don't have oil glands, so go ahead and moisturise

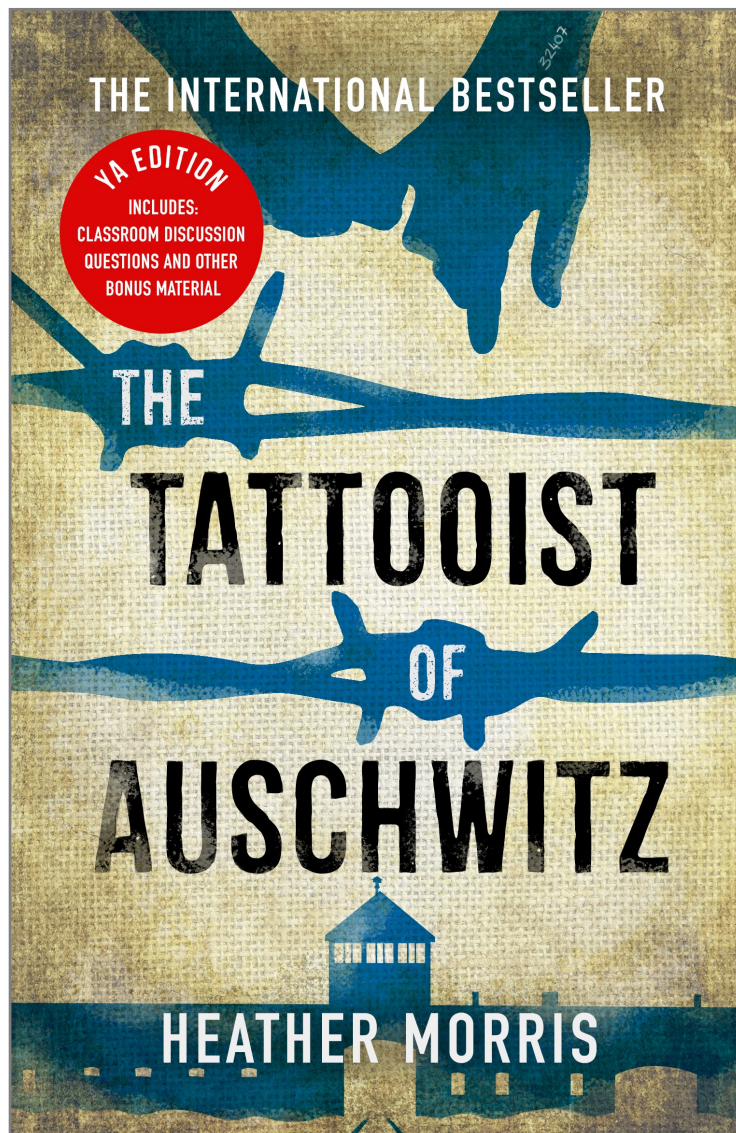
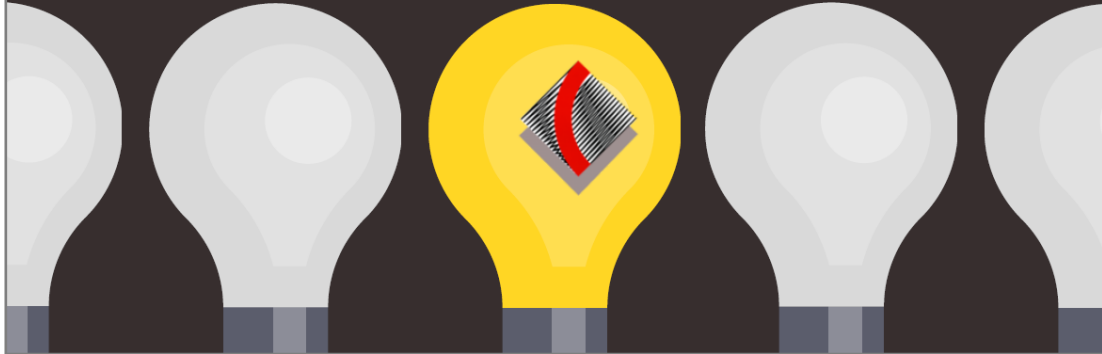
