2020-2021 Student Leaders' Speeches

Due to the current restrictions, unfortunately parents will not be able to attend this event. However, we are planning to livestream the speeches so Student Leaders' parents can view them. The Resumption of School Based Activities

With the resumption of fulltime learning on school campuses and the reduction of National and State-based restrictions, we will be able to resume the majority of school-based activities during Term 3.

Activities which have already resumed include:

- · Ensembles within the school setting, no inter-school activities as yet
- Incursions and external providers which support the delivery of curriculum (eg. music tutors)
- Students may attend other schools for essential curriculum related reasons or placements (eg. auditions or placement tests)
- Day field trips to outdoor locations, sport and recreational facilities, with no physical distancing requirements
- TVET at TAFE
- School photos (no group staff photos allowed).

Activities resuming from the beginning of Term 3 include:

- All school sport and activities, including competitions aligned with current health advice (including activities run by external organisations)
- Inter-school student events and competitions (eg. sport, debating, public speaking, performing arts, Selective Sports High School trials etc)
- Incursions not already permitted involving external adult providers, maintaining distancing and hygiene aligned with the heath advice of the day (eg. school banking talks, sport promotions etc - not directly curriculum related)

Maths Clinic is up and running again!

PROCEDURE FOR EARLY LEAVERS

If a student needs to leave school early, they *must* provide a note from their parent/guardian giving reasons for their partial absence. The student must hand the note in at the student window before **8.30am** where they will be issued with a leave pass. They can then present this pass to their teacher and leave school at the appropriate time.

On Thursdays (sport days) all students in Years 9-11 **MUST** have their early leave notes signed by a member of the PE staff before presenting to the office.

PROCEDURES FOR SICK STUDENTS

Students who are sick during class should see a teacher for written permission to go to sick bay. They must present themselves promptly to the **front office** and politely follow instructions from the office staff, who will then contact a parent/guardian when necessary. Sick bay is used for a short time only. Students should not call their parents in the first instance. *Please be advised the school does not supply any medication, including pain killers, medicated creams, eye drops etc.*

NSW Senior Secondary Student Concession Card

The NSW Senior Secondary Student Concession Card is issued free of charge. This card proves you are a student when travelling on public transport, using an Opal child/youth card.



You must keep the Senior Secondary Student Concession Card with your Opal card or be susceptible to a Transport NSW fine.

The Senior Secondary Student Concession Card is valid until 31 March the following year unless you enter fulltime employment.

To be eligible, you must be 16 years or older and meet one of the following criteria:

- Enrolled in a NSW secondary school or non-Government secondary school
- Registered with NESA as a fulltime home schooled or distance education (OTEN) secondary student
- An International school student who meets the criteria.

To apply for the Senior Secondary Student Concession Card, collect an application form from the CTHS front office.

To replace lost cards, collect a Secondary Student Transport Concession Card replacement form from the CTHS front office. A replacement fee of \$10 applies.
